Internationalisation of Lithuanian Higher Education

➤ The new national strategy/action plan of internationalisation of Lithuanian Higher Education approved in September 2013

Funding from structural funds for implementation of ECTS, preparation of Joint programmes, organisation of placements abroad, student grants and promotion of Lithuanian HE abroad.



Internationalisation of Lithuanian Higher Education National Action Plan for Internationalisation of Lithuanian HE 2013-2016

Priorities:

- Development of joint study programmes and programmes in foreign languages
- 2. Enhancement of competencies of academic personnel.
- 3. Attraction of foreign teaching staff. Promotion of support system for foreign students and minimising of barriersers for incoming foreigners
- 4. Fostering of student and staff mobility
- 5. Support to Centres for Baltic studies abroad
- 6. Support to emigrants of Lithuanian origin, applying to and enrolled in Lithuanian HEIs. Maintenance of relations with Lithuanian emigrants
- 7. Promotion of Lithuanian higher education world-wide

Current situation

The number of LT students enrolled in HEIs is decreasing:

- Demographic variation
 (40 % less graduates in 2023 in comparison to 2009)
- LT graduates chose degree studies abroad
 (7 % of total number of LT students are studying abroad)

The number of foreign students enrolled in LT HEIs is still very low:

 3 % of total number of students enrolled in LT HEIs are foreign students (about 3340 students in 2011-2012 out of 120.000 full-time students)

Current situation

The number of study programmes in foreign languages is still low:


- About 220 study programmes in English and Russian, not all of them ongoing (3000 in Lithuanian)
- 8 accredited joint study programmes (JSP): Vilnius
 University, Mykolas Romeris University, Vytautas Magnus
 University, Vilnius Gediminas Technical University and
 College of Social Sciences
- 16 JSP under preparation



Nordic and other programes (*Erasmus, Erasmus Mundus, NordPlus, State scholarship programmes*)


Development of internationalisation of Lithuanian higher education was mainly influenced by Erasmus programme during the period 1999-2013.

Erasmus statistics: 1999-2012


- **25500** outgoing Lithuanian students for 1-2 semester studies or placements to other European countries
- 10000 incoming students from other European counties
- 9100 outgoing Lithuanian university teachers' and staff visits
- 5600 incoming teachers from other European countries




Most popular destination countries for LT students: Portugal, Germany, Spain, Denmark, Turkey and Finland

Countries sending the highest No of students to LT: Turkey, Spain, France, Germany, Poland and Latvia



Erasmus mobility: outgoing and incoming students by country 2007-2012:




Erasmus mobility: university teachers and staff

Erasmus funding (EUR)



New programme "Erasmus +" 2014-2020

- Budget: 9 billion EUR (40 % for HE)
- 3 types of actions for all sectors:
- Individual mobility (EU and non-EU) 63%
- Cooperation projects (Strategic partnerships, Knowledge Alliances, IT support platforms ...) 25%
- Support for policy reform (HE modernisation agenda...) 4%
- Jean Monnet, Sport


Link to policy objectives

- Europe 2020 targets:
- Raising higher education attainment from 32% to 40%
- Reducing the share of early school leavers from 14% to less than 10%


- New innovative actions to enhance employability and entrepreneurship (Knowledge Alliances and Sector Skills Alliances)
- New ways to trigger policy reform (Policy Experimentation)
- Strong emphasis on cross-sector projects and ICT projects
- More opportunities for VET and HE students through traineeships
- Foster quality improvement in all sectors through staff mobility

Budget allocation 2014 - 2020


- Education and training (77.5%)

Opportunities for individuals

- Nearly 2 million higher education and vocational students would get support abroad, including 450 000 traineeships and apprenticeships
- 200 000 Master's students will benefit from a new loan guarantee scheme and around 34 000 scholarships for Joint Master Degrees
- 600 000 Youth to benefit from international volunteering opportunities and youth exchanges
- 800 000 teachers, trainers, school leaders and youth workers to teach and learn abroad and around 450 000 pupils will learn with peers abroad through school cooperation projects
